

The town of Lübben (Spreewald) is located in the heart of the Spreewald biosphere. It is famous for its cultural experiences and conviviality, but also as a place for leisure and relaxation. On Lübben Schlossinsel both are possible. Located in the heart of the town, the island has something for the entire family. Winding paths lead through the labyrinth and even

from afar you can hear the wind chimes in the Sensory Garden. Just follow the sound of children’s laughter to find the water playground. The Spreewald’s longest wooden bridge leads to the idyllic SpreeLagune. You can take a break from boating or cycling and enjoy a wonderful view of the water at the rest area, or have fun on the climbing net bridge.

Dive into the Lübben experience

From a relaxed canoe trip with the family to more challenging routes for experienced canoeists – the winding waterways around Lübben have something for everyone. Far from the hectic pace of daily life, a broad network of streams awaits discovery. Experience unforgettable nature on your

bike. Excellent cycle paths are the perfect way to enjoy the most beautiful views that the Spreewald has to offer. And if you want to explore the heights, the climbing forest with its wobbly webs, net bridges and ziplines offers a wonderful panorama of the unique landscape.

Enter the watery labyrinth

Your journey into the Spreewald’s unique natural environment starts at the punt harbours at the Schlossinsel or in the town centre. Whether you choose a tour of the town or a trip on the streams of the nature reserves, you’ll discover a mystical water world far from the hustle and bustle of everyday life.

Delicious Spreewald

However, Lübben is not only famous for its nature. It is also a renowned culinary region. Enjoy the inns, restaurants, and cafés, whose proprietors constantly come up with delicious new treats. Lübben’s menus offer a winning mix of regional and seasonal specialties, such as fish, quark cheese with linseed oil and potatoes, yeast ‘plinsen’ (a kind of pancake) and gherkin soup – food to both fill you up and leave you hungry for your next visit to the Spreewald.

Shopping in an oasis of green

Lübben’s town centre with its newly designed marketplace offers an attractive setting for browsing and shopping. The appealing mix of small local businesses, cafés, restaurants, and sights offers an ideal way to both shop and unwind.

Interactive history to see, hear, and touch

Why not get up onto Lübben’s roof? Climb the tower with Brandenburg’s only female tower keeper for a unique view over the Spreewald’s green town. Or accompany the longest-serving night watchman in eastern Germany on one of his nightly tours. Lübben Castle Museum offers not just plenty to see, both also audio and other interactive possibilities. Figures from the past speak, hymns are sung, and treasures lie at your feet.

Paul Gerhardt’s town

The tower of the Paul Gerhardt Church next to the market has been welcoming visitors to the town for hundreds of years. The name of Paul Gerhardt can be found in church and secular song books across the world. Visit the Paul Gerhardt Centre and Church to discover the poetry, connection to nature, and inspirational power of Germany’s most famous hymn writer. This is also the last stop on the Paul Gerhardt Weg, a trail that starts in Berlin and combines important locations linked to Gerhardt with striking natural landscapes.
